Tropical Depression Nineteen formed from a tropical wave southwest of the Cape Verde Islands at 1200 UTC 30 September. The depression rapidly weakened as it moved northward and encountered strong southwesterly wind shear produced by a large upper-level low. The shear removed most of the thunderstorm activity.
