



- A tropical depression is located along the southern coast of Cuba and is expected to move into the Gulf later today and into tonight
- The system will turn NW then N today through Sunday with the system making landfall somewhere between Tampa and Apalachicola Sunday night or Monday morning
- On the forecast track, Four is expected to become a tropical storm by tonight with potential of becoming a hurricane before it makes the Florida landfall
- System likely to become a threat to Georgia and South Carolina on Tuesday and Wednesday
- Current center forecast positions through the next 5 days (if applicable) illustrated by dots
- White swath of potential track error added to each side of the forecast track through day 3
- Hatched swatch of potential track error added to each side of the forecast track days 4-5



Tropical Depression Four

























Expected Storm Total Rainfall and Chance of Rainfall Flooding



Tornado Outlook – Day I and 2












Key Messages for Tropical Depression Four Advisory 4: 5:00 AM EDT Sat Aug 03, 2024

- Heavy rainfall may result in locally considerable flash and urban flooding across portions of Florida and the coastal areas of the Southeast U.S. this weekend through Wednesday. Isolated river flooding will also be possible.
- 2. A Hurricane Watch has been issued for portions of west-central Florida and the Big Bend region, where hurricane conditions are possible late Sunday. Tropical storm conditions are expected farther south along Florida's west coast, including the Tampa Bay area, and across the Dry Tortugas where Tropical Storm Warnings are in effect.
- 3. There is a possibility of life-threatening inundation from storm surge along portions of the west coast of Florida from Bonita Beach to Aucilla River, including Tampa Bay and Charlotte Harbor, where a Storm Surge Watch is in effect.
- 4. Impacts from storm surge, strong winds, and heavy rains are possible elsewhere in Florida and along the southeast coast of the United States from Georgia to North Carolina through the middle of next week, and interests in those areas should continue to monitor the progress of this system. Additional watches and warnings will likely be required later today.
