


...Hurricane Nico maintaining intensity heading for Florida...

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

- A hurricane warning is in effect for the SE US from north of Golden Beach to Edisto Beach South Carolina
- Current center forecast positions through the next 5 days illustrated by dots
- White swath is potential track error through day 3
- Hatched swatch is potential track error on days 4-5
- \*\* Swaths are designed so the actual track will occur inside the cone two-thirds of the time. One-third of the time, the center will track outside the cone.

**NOTE:** Do not focus on the exact track. Impacts can occur well outside the area enclosed by the cone.
