





- The tropical depression is forecast to become a tropical storm by tomorrow and a hurricane in about three days
- Likely impact by the system as a tropical storm or hurricane in South Florida on Tuesday or Wednesday
- Current center forecast positions through the next 5 days (if applicable) illustrated by dots
- White swath of potential track error added to each side of the forecast track through day 3
- Hatched swatch of potential track error added to each side of the forecast track days 4-5

** Swaths are calculated using average track errors and actual track may be well inside, or possibly outside the potential track areas indicated.

















Key Messages for Tropical Depression Nine Advisory 2: 11:00 AM EDT Fri Sep 23, 2022

- 1. The depression is expected to produce heavy rainfall and instances of flash flooding and possible mudslides in areas of higher terrain in Aruba, Bonaire, and Curacao. Heavy rains are also likely to spread into Jamaica, the Cayman Islands, and Cuba in the coming days.
- The depression is expected to approach Jamaica as a tropical storm on Sunday and the Cayman islands as a hurricane on Monday. Watches for these locations may be required later today or on Saturday.
- 3. Early next week the system is forecast to move near or over western Cuba as a strengthening hurricane and then approach the Florida peninsula at or near major hurricane strength, with the potential for significant impacts from storm surge, hurricane-force winds, and heavy rainfall. While it is too soon to determine the exact magnitude and location of these impacts, residents in Cuba, the Florida Keys, and the Florida peninsula should ensure they have their hurricane plan in place and closely monitor forecast updates through the weekend.

- Peak seas currently 9 ft, building to 15-20 ft in Caribbean by Sunday
