



Tropical Weather Outlook

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Disorganized showers and thunderstorms continue over the Bay of Campeche and southern Mexico in association with a broad low pressure area.

This system will move little today and tonight, and little if any development is expected during that time due to interaction with land.

The system should begin to move northward on Thursday, and a tropical depression is likely to form by late Thursday or on Friday when the low moves across the western Gulf of Mexico.

An Air Force Reserve Unit reconnaissance aircraft is scheduled to investigate the area on Thursday.


Heavy rains should also begin to affect portions of the northern Gulf Coast on Friday.












Expected Storm Total Rainfall and Chance of Rainfall Flooding



Valid 7 am Fri – 7 am Sat

- Invest likely to become tropical depression or tropical storm late Thursday or Friday
- System likely to make landfall sometime between Fri night and Sat night
- Winds are forecast to reach 30 kt, but this could increase
- Seas are forecast to peak near 12 ft, but this too could increase
- Rainfall 4-8 inches (isolated higher totals) in Louisiana, Mississippi, Alabama and NW Florida
