


- Storm Surge There is a danger of life-threatening storm surge inundation Friday night along the coasts of Louisiana, Mississippi, Alabama, and the Florida Panhandle. Extremely life-threatening inundation of 9 ft or greater above ground level is possible somewhere between Morgan City, LA and Mobile Bay, AL.
- Wind –Hurricane conditions are expected in the hurricane warning area along the northern Gulf coast beginning Friday night with tropical storm conditions expected to begin by late Fri afternoon.
- Rainfall Flooding As Kris approaches the central Gulf Coast Friday night into Saturday, very heavy rainfall is possible across SE Louisiana through southern Alabama through the weekend. This is likely to result in life-threatening flash and urban flooding.












Significant Wave Height (ft)


Expected Storm Total Rainfall and Chance of Rainfall Flooding


