








Forecast Information

Tropical Storm Helene



NOTE: Do not focus on the exact track. Impacts can occur well outside the area enclosed by the cone.

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- A northwestward motion is expected to continue today, followed by a northward to northnortheastward motion Wednesday then faster motion on Thursday.
- On the forecast track, the center of Helene is forecast to move across the northwestern Caribbean Sea through tonight, and then over the eastern Gulf of Mexico on Wednesday and Thursday.
- Significant strengthening is expected during the next few days, and Helene is forecast to become a hurricane on Wednesday and a major hurricane on Thursday as it moves across the eastern Gulf of Mexico.
- Helene is expected to make landfall as either a Category 2 or 3 hurricane either Thursday afternoon or evening between Tampa Bay and Apalachicola.
- Current center forecast positions through the next 5 days (if applicable) illustrated by dots
 - White swath of potential track error added to each side of the forecast track through day 3
 - Hatched swatch of potential track error added to each side of the forecast track days 4-5

** Swaths are calculated using average track errors and actual track may be well inside, or possibly outside the potential track areas indicated.











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






Expected Storm Total Rainfall and Chance of Rainfall Flooding




Over the Southeastern U.S., Helen is expected to produce total rain accumulations of 4 to 8 inches with isolated totals around 12 inches, bringing a considerable risk of flooding, some of which could be considerable.


Key Messages for Tropical Storm Helene Advisory 5: 11:00 AM EDT Tue Sep 24, 2024



1. Helene is forecast to intensify and be near hurricane strength when it reaches the far northwestern Caribbean Sea early Wednesday. Tropical storm conditions are expected over portions of western Cuba and the northeastern coast of the Yucatan Peninsula with hurricane conditions possible.

2. Helene is expected to rapidly intensify over the eastern Gulf of Mexico and be a major hurricane when it approaches the northeastern Gulf Coast on Thursday. The risk of impacts from life-threatening storm surge and damaging hurricane-force winds continues to increase along the coast of the Florida Panhandle and the Florida west coast. Hurricane and Storm Surge Watches are in effect for much of that area and residents in those areas should follow advice given by local officials.

3. Helene will bring heavy rain to portions of the western Caribbean, which will cause considerable flooding and mudslides across western Cuba. Heavy rainfall will likely result in locally considerable flash and urban flooding across portions of Florida, with isolated flash and urban flooding possible across the Southeast, Southern Appalachians, and the Tennessee Valley Wednesday through Friday. Minor to isolated moderate river flooding will be possible.



Marine Key Messages:

- Marine conditions will quickly deteriorate over the SE Gulf beginning tonight and across the D8 area Wednesday.
- Helen is expected to rapidly intensify and become a hurricane on Wednesday and a major hurricane on Thursday when it approaches the NE Gulf coast
- Peak wind of 100 kt and seas of 35-40 ft are likely to occur on Thursday.
