

- -Flooding Rain threat has increased for portions of the Florida Panhandle.






- A significant increase in forward speed toward the north is expected during the next 24 hours.
- On the forecast track, Helene will make landfall in the Florida Big Bend region this evening as a hurricane Category 3 or 4.
- Weakening is expected after landfall, but Helene's fast forward speed will allow strong, damaging winds, especially in gusts, to penetrate well inland across the southeastern United States, including over the higher terrain of the southern Appalachians.
- After landfall, Helene is expected to turn northwestward and slow down over the Tennessee Valley on Friday and Saturday.
- Current center forecast positions through the next 5 days (if applicable) illustrated by dots
- White swath of potential track error added to each side of the forecast track through day 3
- Hatched swatch of potential track error added to each side of the forecast track days 4-5





Most Likely Arrival Time of Tropical-Storm-Force Winds











Possible river flooding in FL, GA, AL, and SC after Helene passes through.








Key Messages for Hurricane Helene Advisory 12: 4:00 AM CDT Thu Sep 26, 2024

- 1. A catastrophic and deadly storm surge is likely along portions of the Florida Big Bend coast, where inundation could reach as high as 20 feet above ground level, along with destructive waves. There is also a danger of life-threatening storm surge along the remainder of the west coast of the Florida Peninsula. Residents in those areas should follow advice given by local officials and evacuate if told to do so.
- 2. Potentially catastrophic hurricane-force winds are expected within the eyewall of Helene when it makes landfall in the Florida Big Bend region later today. Preparations to protect life and property should be completed this morning before tropical storm conditions arrive. Damaging and life-threatening hurricane-force winds, especially in gusts, will penetrate well inland over portions of northern Florida and southern Georgia later today and tonight where Hurricane Warnings are in effect. Strong wind gusts are also likely farther north across portions of northern Georgia and the Carolinas, particularly over the higher terrain of the southern Appalachians.
- 3. Catastrophic and life-threatening flash and urban flooding, including numerous significant landslides, is expected across portions of the southern Appalachians through Friday. Considerable to locally catastrophic flash and urban flooding is likely for northwestern and northern Florida and the Southeast through Friday. Widespread significant river flooding and isolated major river flooding are likely.
- 4. Tropical storm conditions are expected over portions of western Cuba within the Tropical Storm Warning area. Hurricane Helene will bring heavy rain to portions of the western Caribbean with potentially significant flooding across western Cuba and the northeastern Yucatan Peninsula through this morning.

Key Messages:

- Conditions will continue to rapidly deteriorate in the N-NE Gulf.
- This afternoon NE Gulf:
 - Peak winds of 110-115 kt are likely.
 - Peak seas near 37 ft are likely.
- While Gulf will quickly return to normal on Fri, the Atlantic waters off of NE Florida/Georgia will build on Fri before diminishing Sat.
